Constitution of India Art 137 - Review of judgments or orders by the Supreme Court

Subject to the provisions of any law made by Parliament or any rules made under article 145, the Supreme Court shall have power to review any judgment pronounced or order made by it.

SYNOPSIS

Curative Petition: A curative petition ought to be treated as a rarity and would be maintainable ex debito justitiae only on the grounds set out in the Rupa Ashok Hurra case, (2002) 4 SCC 388; Gurdeep Singh v. State of Punjab, (2005) 10 SCC 468.

Review: Review of a judgment cannot be granted in the garb of a clarification, Saurabh Chaudri (Dr.) v Union of India, (2004) 5 SCC 618.
