

Constitution of India Art 215 - High Courts to be courts of record

Every High Court shall be a court of record and shall have all the powers of such a court including the power to punish for contempt of itself.

Jurisdictional Question: The High Court being a superior Court of Record is entitled to consider questions regarding its own jurisdiction when raised before it, Naresh Shridhar Mirajkar v. State of Maharashtra, AIR 1967 SC 1.
