

Constitution of India Art 216 - Constitution of High Courts

Every High Court shall consist of a Chief Justice and such other Judges as the President may from time to time deem it necessary to appoint.

SYNOPSIS

Exercise of Power: Fixing the strength of judges in each High Court is a purely executive function left to the discretion of the Government of India and there are no judicially manageable standards for the purpose of controlling or guiding the exercise of that discretion by the President, *S.P Gupta v. Union of India*, 1981 Supp SCC 87.
